These EFAs define BEC’s high-level priorities on the climate-nature-circularity nexus to galvanise business actions, drive cross-sector collaborations, and maximise impact.

The update will strengthen BEC’s efforts in addressing pressing environmental challenges, reinforce our mission, enhance our influence in public policy, foster collaboration among members, and drive impactful initiatives that contribute to a sustainable future. It also aligns BEC with global imperatives while addressing the unique challenges faced by businesses in Hong Kong and beyond. To support our EFAs, new arrangements with the Advisory Groups will become effective from 1 October 2025.

BEC Media Luncheon 2025



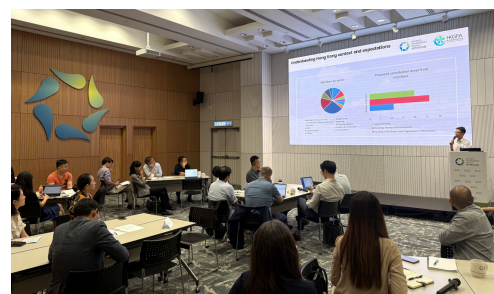
BEC organised our annual Media Luncheon 2025 on 30 July which showcased our new strategic direction, aligned with global environmental imperatives and addressing the pressing challenges faced by businesses in Hong Kong.

Specifically, we have updated our Environmental Focus Areas to include Climate Change, Circular Economy, and Nature and Biodiversity. We will also make changes to the Advisory Groups with the aim to enhance sustainability efforts and influence public policies for impactful change.

During the event, we also shared BEC’s policy recommendations to the Government on the upcoming 2025 Policy Address, covering key environmental issues such as the climate action plan, producer responsibility scheme, the upscaling of sustainable fuels, and nature conservation.

Inaugural meeting of the Taskforce on Nature-related Financial Disclosures Hong Kong Consultation Group

On 20 June, BEC and Hong Kong Green Finance Association jointly convened the inaugural meeting of the Taskforce on Nature-related Financial Disclosures ("TNFD") Hong Kong Consultation Group. The meeting outlined the scope of the Consultation Group, shared existing TNFD resources and discussed actions required to encourage adoption among corporates and financial institutions in Hong Kong.



Members shared their perspectives on the current state of TNFD in Hong Kong, identifying key challenges faced by organisations and contributions the Consultation Group could make towards to address those challenges. The discussion highlighted needs for locally adapted guidance on parts of the framework including the LEAP Approach, consolidated ecosystem data, legal expertise, and demonstrable case studies of local TNFD adoption best practices as priority needs for stakeholders to consider and address.

Cross-sector and public-private cooperation are critical to advancing TNFD adoption, and more broadly, for promoting biodiversity conservation through corporate action. We are excited to begin this collaborative effort and work together toward a greener future for Hong Kong!

BEC x Hang Seng ESG Workshop – Textile & Garment Sector

"BEC x Hang Seng Bank ESG Workshop – Textile & Garment Sector" successfully concluded on 30 June, empowering SMEs from the sector to accelerate their business transition towards sustainability. Industry experts led the participants in exploring the environmental impact of the textile & garment sector, examining emerging global regulatory trends, and outlining practical steps for businesses to implement effective ESG strategies.



Towards Net Zero: Smart Building Innovations from Europe and Hong Kong



Co-organised by BEC and The European Chamber of Commerce in Hong Kong, and sponsored by Invest Hong Kong and NonnaAnna, the event “Towards Net Zero: Smart Building Innovations from Europe and Hong Kong” wrapped up successfully on 9 July. The seminar explored innovative strategies to reduce carbon emissions in construction and building operations, covering topics such as sustainable materials, energy efficiency, renewable energy integration and innovative design practices.

We were pleased to have Mr King Leung from Invest Hong Kong, and Prof Martin Zhu from i2Cool Limited sharing their insights on navigating the green tech market and innovations in electric-free cooling technology. Ms Elena Geremia from NonnaAnna Studio also presented effective strategies for transforming ESG efforts into visibility, credibility, and market trust.

There were two engaging panel discussions at the seminar. The first, titled “Integration of Smart Technologies for Net-zero Built Environment,” delved into the critical role of technology achieving net-zero goals in the construction industry. The second panel addressed the “Challenges and Opportunities for Creating a Net-zero Built Environment”, highlighting the collaborative efforts needed to drive sustainable change.

The Second Climate Risk Management Forum 2025



Co-organised by Business Environment Council, Real Estate Developers Association of Hong Kong, and The Hong Kong Federation of Insurers, supported by the Development Bureau, and sponsored by Hongkong Land Limited, “The Second Climate Risk Management Forum 2025” held on 11 July brought together government speakers and representatives from the real estate and insurance sectors to exchange insights and strategies for addressing climate-related challenges, particularly flooding and coastal hazards driven by extreme weather.

A highlight of the event was the panel discussion moderated by BEC Head – Policy & Research Mr Merlin Lao, where government representatives and industry experts shared practical tools and global perspectives to navigate the complexities of climate risk management.

BEC Response to Updates to Hong Kong Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan – Public Consultation Document

BEC submitted our views on the updates to the Hong Kong Biodiversity Strategy and Action Plan (“BSAP”) – Public Consultation Document (July 2025) to the HKSAR Government on 11 July. The submission reflects insights and feedback collected through multiple rounds of engagement with BEC members during the two-month public consultation period.

As the BSAP outlines a 10-year implementation timeframe leading up to 2035, it is crucial that the updated plan is sufficiently ambitious to protect Hong Kong’s unique biodiversity for the future. The submission builds on a previous BEC policy recommendation submission in December 2024. Key points in our submission include integrating biodiversity considerations into development, corporate assessments, actions and disclosures on biodiversity and nature, high-level policy signalling and synergising with climate policy, financing biodiversity and sustainable consumption and procurement.

The conservation of Hong Kong’s biodiversity necessitates an interdisciplinary, multi-stakeholder approach that engages the entire society. With concrete measures backed by strong government policy and commitment, we can make significant strides in enhancing Hong Kong’s regional and international position in biodiversity conservation and sustainable development.

In addition, attendees had the unique opportunity to ride on the world's first tri-axle hydrogen fuel cell double-deck bus.

Fueling the Future: Global Insights on Sustainable Aviation Fuel for Hong Kong

BEC had the honour to host Mr Chris Tindal – renowned expert and ambassador for sustainable aviation fuel (“SAF”), for a thought-provoking public lecture on 16 July. Drawing on his extensive international experience, Mr Tindal highlighted that SAF can reduce greenhouse gas emissions by up to 80% while also unlocking new economic and innovation opportunities for Hong Kong.

Supported by the U.S. Consulate General in Hong Kong and Macau, the session sparked meaningful dialogue on how Hong Kong can position itself as a leader in green aviation, covering a range of topics from global policy frameworks to local implementation strategies.



In January 2024, BEC launched the Hong Kong Sustainable Aviation Fuel Coalition Programme to engage stakeholders in developing Hong Kong’s position as a regional and global hub for SAF. BEC has published the Policy Whitepaper on SAF Strategy for Hong Kong last year to provide policy recommendations to uplift SAF. BEC is also committed to inviting key stakeholders and experts on SAF, like Mr Tindal, to enrich the discussion around SAF for the benefits of the Hong Kong aviation and environmental community.

Swire Properties Green Performance Pledge Forum 2025: Advancing Sustainability Together



The annual Green Performance Pledge (“GPP”) Forum was successfully held on 3 July 2025 at Taikoo Place ArtisTree. The event brought together over 160 participants representing more than 60 tenant companies and partners, reflecting the growing community dedicated to driving sustainability in Hong Kong’s built environment.

Record-Breaking Tenant Participation and Achievements

The 2024/2025 year marked a significant milestone in tenant engagement and performance, with 113 tenants attaining Member, Silver, Gold, or Platinum ratings for environment performance – a remarkable 51% increase from 75 tenants in the previous year. The continued growth in tenant participation and achievement highlights the positive impact of collaboration within the tenant community. These efforts are vital in supporting Hong Kong’s journey towards a more sustainable future.

Celebrating Joint Achievements

From April 2024 to March 2025, GPP tenants in Hong Kong delivered impressive environmental results:

- Electricity consumption was reduced by approximately 436,400kWh, equivalent to the annual consumption of 132 three-person Hong Kong households;
- Over 200 tonnes of waste were diverted from landfill, achieving a waste diversion rate of 29% through enhanced recycling and reduction initiatives;
- Water consumption intensity was lowered by 13%, saving around 5,240 m³ of water.

A major recent milestone is the launch of the Environmental Dashboards on the Tenant Portal, now accessible to all participating Hong Kong tenants. This integrated digital platform consolidates all energy, water and waste data, enabling tenants easily to track, analyse and benchmark performance. Users can monitor monthly trends, compare year-on-year performance, and benchmark themselves against other GPP participants to improve their performance continuously. The feature is also being rolled out progressively to GPP tenants in the Chinese Mainland.

Knowledge Sharing and Engagement

Through Swire Properties' ongoing partnership with BEC, the GPP Academy will continue to serve as a dynamic platform for ideas exchange on sustainability topics. Past workshops include a guided Nature Exploration Tour at Taikoo Square which focused on urban biodiversity; green building tours of Swire Properties' newest office developments; a visit to the West New Territories Landfill and T-PARK to explore waste reduction strategies; and a sustainable office design workshop featuring a furniture repair and refurbishment experience. These quarterly workshops have engaged over 390 participants to date. We will continue to offer tenants valuable opportunities to access industry experts and share best practices.

Airport Authority Hong Kong ("AAHK") released 60,000 fish fry and one million shrimp fry into the waters near Hong Kong International Airport ("HKIA") on 6 June, National Fish Releasing Day, to enhance marine biodiversity and fisheries resources. The release took place at the HKIA Approach Areas, where vessel access is limited and 600 artificial reefs have been deployed by AAHK. All fish fry released were native species with declining populations, including 10,000 crescent sweetlips bred at Sai King fish farm under a project funded by AAHK's Fisheries Enhancement Fund, marking the first use of locally bred fish for release. AAHK plans to conduct additional releases to support the region's fisheries resources.



Demonstrating proactive environmental leadership, **China State Construction Engineering (Hong Kong) Limited ("CSHK")** has pioneered a mobile, automated vehicle washer using recycled wastewater. This innovation extends the company's engineering expertise beyond green construction technology to drive tangible sustainability gains at their sites. Deployed since late 2023, this sensor-operated system cleans vehicles 24/7 without manual intervention. Wastewater from vehicle washes is captured, filtered and chemically purified for reuse, with auto-replenishment compensating for evaporation. The new technology has significantly reduced vehicle-washing water consumption, as well as labour costs through automated sludge management. This initiative reflects CSHK's commitment to applying its construction acumen strategically, transforming operational challenges into sustainable solutions through practical ingenuity.

Hang Lung Properties is deepening tenant collaboration through its Changemakers: Tenant Partnerships on Sustainability initiative, driving energy efficiency, waste reduction, and community wellbeing. The company recently honoured tenant achievements at the Tenant Sustainability Awards in Hong Kong and Shanghai. Inspired by its 2022 partnership with a global luxury group, the Changemakers Programme completed a successful pilot in 2024. To date, Hang Lung has collaborated with 71 tenants across 18 properties and 305,000 sqm of leased space. As Hang Lung progresses toward its 2050 net zero goal, the programme exemplifies its leadership in sustainability and commitment to industry-wide transformation through meaningful partnerships.

Henderson Land recently joined forces with fellow BEC Member The Green Earth for a rewarding plantation enrichment programme at Yuen Tun over two weekends. The Henderson Warmth Volunteer Team rolled up their sleeves for tree planting and vital tree care tasks, from nurturing seedlings to weeding and fertilising. This initiative drives positive environmental impact through urban greening and biodiversity support. To date, over 47,000 seedlings have taken root at the site.



A total of 12 finalist teams showcased how they used seed money from **HK Electric** to create innovative projects in carbon reduction, energy efficiency and renewable energy at the “Green Energy Dreams Come True” competition held at Central Market. In the secondary school category, two teams tied for first place. The project “Every Drop Counts” developed a solar-powered water generator and diffuser, while “Arbor AI” applied infrared technology and artificial intelligence to monitor plant health. In the tertiary category, the champion team designed algae-based “Green Living Walls”. All winning teams will be invited to visit green energy facilities in mainland China, gaining valuable exposure and insights that will further their sustainability journeys.

Swire Properties’ development Taikoo Li Sanlitun’s Building N15 and The RED, and Taikoo Li Chengdu have been awarded a three-star rating—the highest rating possible—in the Assessment Standard for Photovoltaics, Energy Storage, Direct Current, and Flexibility (“PEDF”) Systems in Buildings scheme (T/CABEE 055-2023) by a first class national association of building energy efficiency. Taikoo Li Sanlitun was recognised for the PEDF design and operations, achieving an annual energy savings of approximately 200,000 kWh. Swire Properties will continue implementing PEDF systems to its other portfolios, reducing power conversion loss and enhancing grid resilience.

Towngas is accelerating its clean energy transformation through strategic advancements in green methanol and hydrogen initiatives in Hong Kong. As a green maritime fuel producer, Towngas recently signed MOUs with the Transport and Logistics Bureau and various local and international partners in shipping, trading, and bunkering to support Hong Kong’s development as a green maritime fuel hub. With agreement-in-principle from the HKSAR Government’s Inter-departmental Working Group on Using Hydrogen as Fuel, Towngas and a local company will deploy hydrogen power generation equipment to supply electricity to a recreation facility during golf event of the 15th National Games in November.

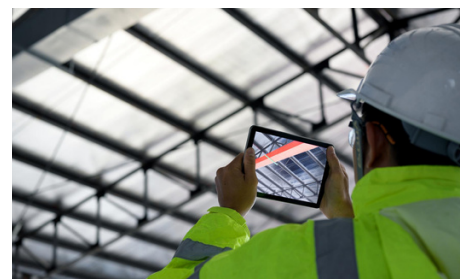
On 12 June, **SuperPanther** signed an agreement with an Austrian commercial vehicle manufacturer for the industrial production of electric trucks. The two parties will leverage their strengths to produce the next generation of high-performance electric trucks to the highest industrial standards. The first all-electric SuperPanther truck under this partnership is scheduled to roll off the production line of Steyr Automotive by the end of 2025. This marks SuperPanther's entry into the European market.

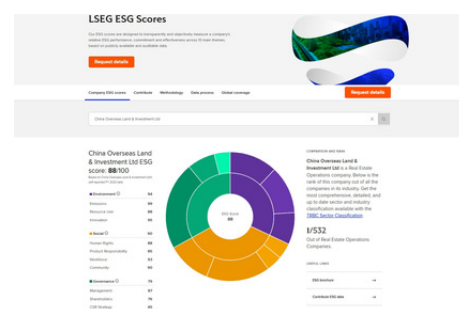

Bigger Life recently received the HKQAA Green and Sustainable Contribution Award 2025 for Advocate of Sustainable Facility and Community Caring. Since 2024, the company's UNESCO-aligned SDG education programmes have reached over 200 Hong Kong citizens, including non-Chinese students, seniors, and families. With the contribution of its committed instructors as well as ESG and SDG partners, Bigger Life is working towards achieving SDG Goal 11 through building sustainable communities.

According to the latest London Stock Exchange Group ESG Scores, **China Overseas Land and Investment Limited ("COLI")** topped the list for the first time, surpassing 532 real estate companies around the globe and becoming the world's industry leader. As of 30 June, COLI has made significant progress in environmental, social and governance aspects, becoming the world's top real estate company with a score of 88 points out of 100.



In April 2025, **DFI Retail Group** commissioned Hong Kong's first CO₂-based natural gas refrigeration system at its Cloudview Market Place store. Recognised as one of the most environmentally friendly refrigeration technologies, the system replaces legacy high-GWP refrigerants and uses CO₂ with an ultra-low GWP of just one. This transition significantly reduces Scope 1 emissions and improves energy efficiency for Scope 2. This initiative contributes towards the company's Net Zero 2050 ambition and reflects its commitment to lead the sustainability transformation of the retail landscape in Asia.



ECHO ASIA collaborated with students from a local university to release Hong Kong's Digital Banking User Experience Survey 2025. The survey gathered insights from 508 Hong Kong residents through an online questionnaire, revealing that 24.1% have a negative impression of digital banks, and only 31.7% consider them their primary account. Respondents who do not use digital banks as their primary account mainly cited security concerns, lack of trust, and limited service offerings. The most valued services are account opening promotions and savings, yet 53.2% feel traditional banks better meet their savings needs.

A carbon footprint assessment of **GREENTECH** gypsum blocks, conducted in compliance with ISO 14067:2018 and PAS 2050:2011, revealed that producing one ton emits only 203 kg CO₂ equivalent – a figure significantly lower than that of traditional concrete and cement, at approximately half and one-third of their emissions, respectively. This reduction is achieved through the use of recycled materials and energy-efficient production processes. Widely applied in non-load-bearing partition walls, gypsum blocks support Hong Kong's sustainability goals by offering a greener alternative to conventional construction materials.

TÜV Rheinland is now a recognised certification body for the EU's CertifHy-RFNBO programme, enabling it to certify sustainably produced hydrogen and renewable fuels of non-biological origin.
